- How do we fortify ourselves?

Supporting Black Youth with T1D

- Evidence based interventions to address such disparities are promote health equity are lacking
- Parental Monitoring- parenting behaviors involve information seeking about a youth's daily activities as well as direct supervision and oversight of those activities
 - Those parents that were more involved with patients' diabetes management had better outcomes
- Multicenter Effectiveness implementation study
 - 4 peds centers in Chicago and 3 in Detroit, ages 10-15
 - o 3M's medicine, meter and meals
 - Psychoeducational content developed with primary caregiver of Black adolescents with T1D
 - Brief eHealth intervention was successful in improving glycemic control for Black adolescents with T1D
- Recruitment of Black families
 - Resources allocated appropriately



 Qualitative work with families, personalized touch and approach, tailoring to the family, relationship approach

Preliminary Survey Results

Racial Equity

- 21% peds and 33% of adult, feel all their team can articulate on medical racism
- Peds have implemented more strategies to address racism
- Majority of centers complete training annually
- Peds have more resources to address contributors to inequities

LGBTQ+

- Majority said yes to gender affirming care
- Peds more regularly documenting pronouns
- Majority document sex assigned at birth
- Majority document patient self-identified gender identity
- Most clinic-self identified gender outside 'Male' and 'Female'
